The evening was a resounding success, highlighting the exceptional musical talent nurtured at Hayes Primary School. This wonderful showcase will now become an annual tradition.

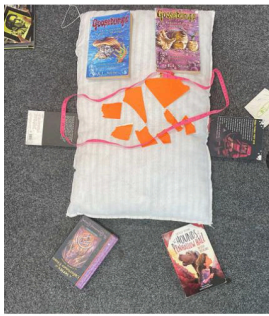
Sports Celebration Evening

Taskmaster Club has proved a success and has been well attended. This is one of the tasks where the children had to create something that looked like their teacher, Miss Jarrett.

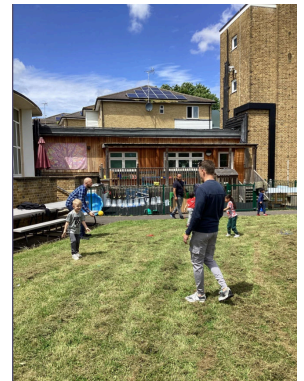
Both Sports days were well represented by parents and family members and the children enjoyed the day.
